REPORT OF THE UGC EXPERT COMMITTEE WHICH VISITED PROPOSAL FOR CONFERMENT OF DEEMED TO BE UNVIERSITY STATUS IN THE NAME AND STYLE OF PROPOSED CHRIST UNIVERSITY UNDER SECTION 3 OF THE UGC ACT, 1956

BACKGROUND

The Christ College was established in 1969 by the founder of the first indigenous catholic religious congregation, Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI) to provide quality education. The Christ College owns 25 acres and 21.5 Guntas of land in the heart of Bangalore city, extending to an area of about 97000 sq.mtrs.

The Christ College has made rapid progress and growth since its inception by introducing innovative and professional courses in Science, Computer Applications, Commerce & Management and Social Sciences etc. The institution has well-organized and meaningful extension programs carried through their various centers like Centre For Social Action (CSA), Centre for Education Beyond Curriculum (CEDBEC) etc. The Christ College is the first educational institution in Karnataka to be accredited in by National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC), followed by re-accreditation with A+ Level rating in 2005.

The Christ College is affiliated to Bangalore University. It has collaborations with many accredited foreign Universities like Western Michigan University (USA), Griffith University (Australia) Liverpool Hope University (UK), Swansea University (UK), OHIO University (USA), Norway Science University of Science and Technology, Duta Wacana Christian University (Indonesia) etc. the Christ College is also a member of the University Study Abroad Consortium (USAC) for providing selective educational support to the students of the USAC member institutions.

In addition, the Christ College is also accredited and authorized by several Professional Institutes in and outside India, such as Institute of Chartered Accountants of India, Institute of Company Secretaries of India, International Air Transport Association (Canada), Chartered Institute of Management Accountants (UK) etc for conducting its' educational programs. In recognition of performance and potential of the College in conducting and introducing programs of research and innovation, the UGC granted Autonomous Status to the Christ College in the year 2004. college has been recognized as a College with 'Potential for Excellence' (CPE) by the UGC in 2006 for which a grant of Rs.1.00 crore has been given te the UGC. 'India Today' magazine, in its June 2007 issue, has ranked CLRIST COLLEGE among the top ten Colleges of India in all streams of education (Science, Commerce & Social Sciences), in its published report on the basis of its scientific survey. The College has been ranked among the first 25 colleges of India in respect of MBA program as per the survey conducted by the 'Outlook' magazine as published in its issue of September 2007. Currently, the institute offers 14 PG and 48 UG Programmes in Sciences, Commerce/Management and Social Sciences including Education and Law, affiliated to Bangalore University, with a total admitted strength of 5767 students from India as well as from other countries.

With a view to further expand the facilities especially for the proposed Deemed to be University to provide for innovative post graduate and Research programs and activities, the Christ College, has initiated and commenced construction of a new Block of 12 storied building of modern amenities, with a built up area of about 38000 sq meters and costing about Rs 60 crores. The College is awaiting certain approvals from authorities concerned, to hasten progress in this regard.

The Christ College is a well-established and well-recognized provider of quality education with a mission and vision to sustain the standards of Educational Excellence in the world. Its sprawling and aesthetically landscaped campus is centrally located in the city of Bangalore, which is well connected, by Air, Rail and Road.

The MHRD, Government of India forwarded the proposal of Christ University to UGC to examine for the conferment of Deemed to be University Status under section 3 of UGC Act, 1956. Accordingly the Chairman, UGC constituted the following Expert Committee to make on the spot assessment of the infrastructure and academic facilities to consider its proposal for conferment of Deemed to be University Status.

from the concerned State the comments from State Government within 30 days vide D.O.No.F.26-12/2007 (CPP-I) dated 2.7.2007 (Annexure-VII) with regard to potential, academic excellence and financial viability of the Institute to maintain and sustain itself as a deemed university. However, the State Government of Karnataka declined NOC for all the applicant institutes for deemed to be university locaed in Karnataka without giving any reasons for rejections in respect of each institution.

> It has been noted that UGC has written a letter vide F. No. 6-24/2005 (CPP-I) dated September, 2007 to State Government of Karntaka (Annexure-VIII) seeking reasons for recommending the case of applicant institutions located in Karnataka for conferment of deemed to be university status. Their response is still awaited.

The Committee noted that the UGC has granted the autonomous status to the Christ College which acknowledges the financial and academic viability of this institution. The Committee further noted that the Christ College is also granted with the accreditation A+ level by NAAC which further endorses the quality of education in the institution to sustain its academic viability. The Committee is also informed that the UGC has granted one crore rupees to Christ College as Centre of Potential of Excellence which leaves no doubt about the potential of this institution to sustain as a deemed university.

In view of above, the Committee is of the opinion that case of Christ University may be considerred as Institute having all the potential, academic, excellence and financial viability to maintain and sustain itself as a deemed university without prejudice to the outcome of above correspondence with the State Government.

OBSERVATIONS OF THE COMMITTEE

The Expert Committee after detailed visits to all the departments, general facilities like hostels, libraries, sports facilities and after due interactions with the management, faculty, staff and students makes the following observations:-

(i) Observations of the Group of Science subjects

The College offers postgraduate courses in Computer Science (MCA), M.Sc.(Computer Sc.), Physics (M.Sc.) and Mathematics (M.Sc.). An exclusive well equipped laboratory with network of latest microprocessor-based computers and software is available for students to provide them hand-owned training in various aspects of computer and their applications. M.Sc. (Computer Science) is a programme with specialization in two areas and includes the core areas of computer science. M.Sc. Physics programme at the college gives emphasis in Molecular and Crystal Growth as well as astronomy. M.Sc. course in Mathematics is a programme which aims to develop mathematical ability in the students with acute and abstract reasoning. The College offers through lectures, seminars, workshops, group discussions as well as talk by experts. These courses are quite popular among students.

Apart from above, the college offers various courses for B.Sc. degree such as computer applications, computer science, mathematics, electronics, statistics, chemistry, botany, zoology, physics and biotechnology.

The classes and laboratory are spacious and equipped with the instruments equired for the conducting the practicals. The students are exposed to 394 relevant knowledge through the quality teaching, text and reference books. The practicals are carried out rigorously. The students are appreciative of the practical courses and satisfied with the teachers. There is a close interaction between the students. Being an affiliated college, it is important to note that a personalized teaching is given importance. It was found through discussion with the students that they (students) get the placement in reputed organizations.

Although the faculty members, because of affiliated nature of the college have a lot of constraint to carry out the research in their departments, many teachers are active in research. Even being handicapped by academic facilities and limitations, some teachers have published the research work in both national and international journals of high repute. It is important to note that teachers are actively participating in the National as well as International seminars/ workshops/ symposium and conferences. teachers have minor research projects funded by mainly the college and other agencies like UGC. The teachers are not only inculcating interest in the mind of the students about frontier areas of their subject but are also encouraging to undertake small research oriented projects which is visible from the survey made, data collected and analyzed the same by the students of department of statistics. The College has motivated team of well qualified and experienced faculty members dedicated to the cause of education. On getting the academic freedom, they can carry out the research in their respective specialized subjects. There are clear indications from some of the publications that many teachers have potential to evolve as serious researchers.

(ii) Observations of the Group of Management, MCA and Hotel Management and PGDM (AICTE Nominee)

All the four AICTE programs have well equipped laboratories and well furnished class rooms. They have a rich Central Libray which caters to these Departments as well. The Library is fully computerized and is a member of DELNET.

In all the four Departments, sufficient, qualified and experienced faculty is available. However, in the opinion of the Committee more faculty with Ph.Ds qualification should be available.

The Committee further observes that four AICTE approved programs are not NBA accredited. However, the Christ College as such is A+ accredited by NAAC.

In the light of the observation given above, the Committee recommends that the College may be granted the status of Deemed University asw it will immensely benefit all the stake holders including teachers, students and community at large.

(iii) Observations of the Group of Social Sciences including Law and Education departments

The College offers following courses, such as, optional and functional English, Economics, Mass Media, Communication, Political Science, Sociology, Philosophy, Psychology, Education, Media Studies, Social Work, Journalism and History.

The courses in these areas found to be satisfactory and students who have opted for these courses felt satisfied. These courses provide space for diological learning. The courses like Social Work, Mass Communication, Journalism are also field oriented. In these courses, teaching encourages

project writing, chosing of an issue and writing the projects. The courses the being offered are quite comprehensive, covering large areas of the subjects concerned.

The interaction and discussion with students and teachers in respective departments are qualitatively good. However, due to the constraint of the system, the departments are not able to carry out the research work as desired by them but it is clear that these departments have potential to take research activities in many relevant areas of the subjects. It appears that the College has interest in re-casting the courses to make them interdisciplinary and socially relevant.

Education Department (NCTE nominee observations)

B.Ed. programme of one year's duration is being run by the College. Through in depth discussion on methodology being used for academic interactions and visits to student services such as the library, the laboratory and the ET facilities available in the college, it transpired that the academic calendar being followed is in consonance with required norms and standards.

It was observed that the infrastructural and other physical facilities satisfy the NCTE norms. The faculty is adequate for the B.Ed. programme being run by the College excepting the availability of Principal as per guidelines of NCTE. It is understood that the position is advertised by the College and selection for the said position is in the offing.

The academic programme as in operation is quite upto the mark in as much as the emphasis on skill acquisition, awareness and knowledge part is concerned.

The library of the college of Education has 3000 titles (books) and adequate number of periodicals and the same are as per NCTE norms.

It is suggested that in order to promote a culture of in service education the college should strive to get upgraded to a CTE status by approaching the MHRD, Delhi.

It has developed bridge courses for performance improvement for slow learners to help the students to upgrade their knowledge.

- ➤ The College has developed Curriculum Development Training Programs in consultation with experts from Industry and Research to meet basic requirements for higher studies in emerging areas and research.
- ➤ The College has initiated international collaboration in UG and PG courses in the form of twinning/ partenership programmes. The list of the foreign universities with which the college has signed MoUs is as follows:-

- > The College has established an office of International Affairs to promote this trend further. This has been helping the College for faculty enrichment through exposure to international programmes and shared knowledge with faculty members to promote research, methodology etc. However, the Committee observed that if they want to continue these programmes after getting the deemed university status they may be advised to obtain the approval from UGC and other statutory bodies, wherever required.
- The College possesses highly qualified faculty members as per norms of UGC/ statutory councils possess and their courses have approvals of respective statutory councils wherever required.
