SEED MONEY SCHEME

The Seed Money Scheme is designed to stimulate competitive research in strategic areas of national or international importance, promote innovative product and technology development, and/or facilitate the start of research programmes that shall potentially develop into creative ventures on their own through external funding.

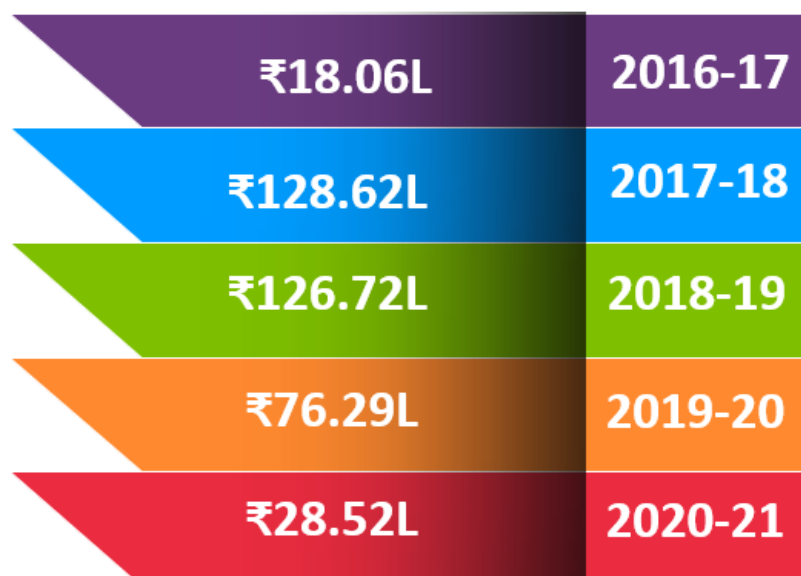
Objectives:

- To aid faculty members to start research programmes that have the potential to sustain by attracting funds from external agencies.
- To test a novel idea and generate preliminary results before submitting proposals to external agencies.
- To promote inter-faculty collaboration in emerging areas.
- To promote the generation of IPR and product/process development.
- To attract and retain talent.

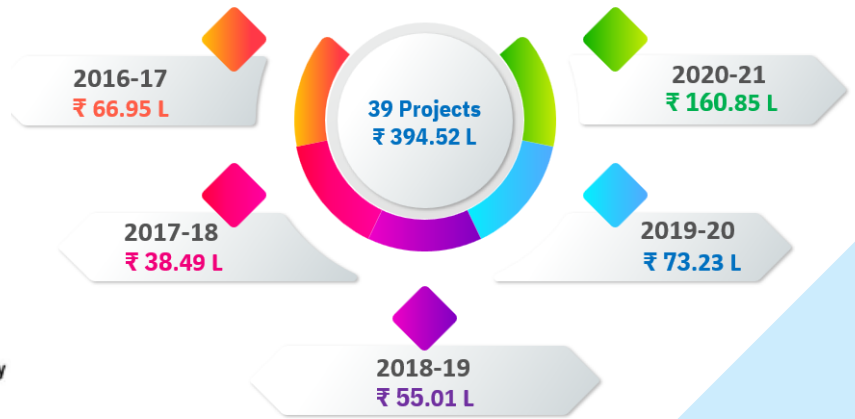
Eligibility

- A full-time regular faculty member of CHRIST (Deemed to be University) with a PhD degree and with a proven track record of quality research with at least one semester of service.
- Only one application for Seed Grant can be submitted at a time. Seed funding will be awarded only once for a faculty within three years of joining.

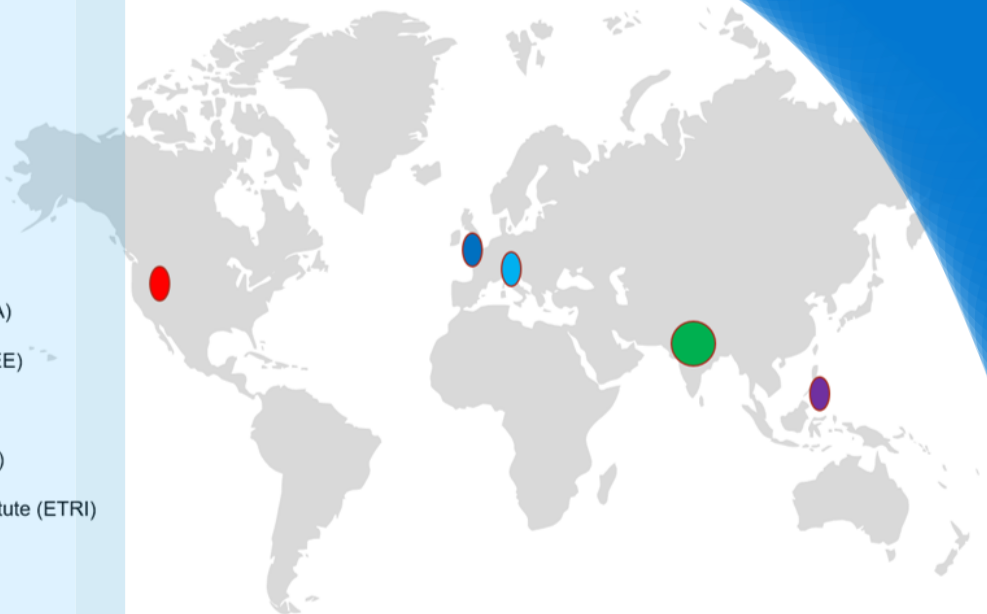

TRAINING THE TRAINER WORKSHOP ON PROJECT PROPOSAL WRITING (2021 - 2022)

Training the trainer workshop on PROJECT PROPOSAL WRITING (5 Phases) with selected 26 Faculty members from all schools across campuses was conducted from April 2021 - January 2022.

The topics covered in all five phases include

- Elements of the Project Proposal
- Networking
- Project proposal writing
- How to develop project proposals for large grant calls
- How to develop proposals for COVID-19 grants
- How to quickly sketch out and construct a project proposal
- Suggestions for starting new research projects in the field of expertise
- Familiarize proposal writing formats with University details
- Preparation of Concept Notes, ToR, Expression of Interest, Letter of Intent, MoUs, MoAs, and
- How to prepare collaborative research projects.

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THE DEPARTMENT SPECIFIC TRAINING THE TRAINER (TTT) WORKSHOP ON PROJECT PROPOSAL WRITING

The Centre for Research - Projects (CRP) is organizing a department specific Training the Trainer (TTT) workshop on Project Proposal Writing. This is a recurring program to the Faculty members to expedite the learning of technical writing skills for the project proposals. This workshop looks at how to develop effective project proposal writing skills that allow the Faculty members to be able to train and assist their colleagues in evolving project proposals.

The workshop is expected to provide a constructive one to one training to faculty members (2 Principal Investigators having MRPs from CRP) from each department through 5 phases. All phases will be covered on Project proposal writing, the possibilities to develop multidisciplinary project proposals, updates on trainings to other Faculty members in their respective department, seminars, publications and follow up on Proposal submissions.

A manual on Departmental specific project proposal writing will be developed as an output of this workshop with the support of the participants.

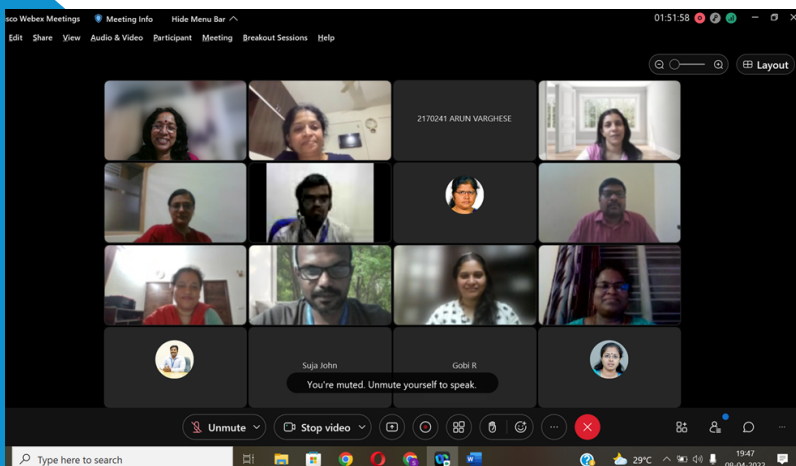


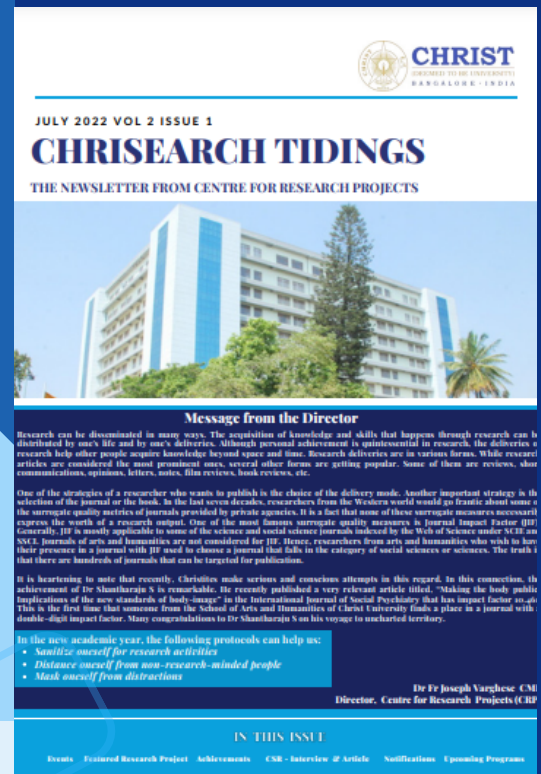
PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMME ON PROJECT PROPOSAL WRITING & MANAGEMENT
